Community Outreach SES PTO I attended a PTO meeting on September 20<sup>th</sup> to finalize plans for the Spectacular Science Show on September 21<sup>st</sup>. Ninety people attended. We also discussed Trick-or-Treat and how the Library and PTO can work to make it a safe and successful community event. As a result, the PTO will be collecting candy to deliver to houses along the usual Trick-or-Treat route on Leverett Road.

A few interested parents, residents of Leverett Road and Pastor Mark Ellis met at the Library on Friday, October 5<sup>th</sup> to continue the Halloween discussion. The Shutesbury Church will be giving out candy this year.

I have planned a Halloween work party on Sunday, October 28<sup>th</sup> to carve pumpkins and make scarecrows to line the common and Leverett Road on Halloween evening.
