WIRED WEST WILL COVER THE LAST MILE Wired West has picked a governance model that will come to the 45 towns to vote on. Wired West is continuing its efforts to bring Internet service the last mile to all who are under served and suffer with dial up. The model is a "lighting plant." It will take 2 town meeting 2/3s votes to create a Shutesbury lighting plant. The law, MGL ch 164, 47E, has been amended to add broadband, cable and other telecommunications services. Then the lighting plants of the 45 towns will come together as a
