Minutes from December approved.

Director's Report from January discussed.

A question arose about the expendable trust. In 1933 William Spear gave library telephone company stock that was converted to cash and is held in a trust for the care and keeping of the library. The principle is now \$78,000. The interest goes into the expendable trust. A little goes to the library budget. The interest - \$672 - is the lowest it has been. Mary Anne will ask the Town Treasurer how the money is invested if there is another way to move this money into an account that gets a higher return, since this is a very low return. Must have at least 4% to spend money and grow the account.

We noted that the amount of money donated from Friends was surprisingly high this year, given the pandemic.

January Director Report approved unanimously.

Annual Report discussed.

We trustees were really quite surprised and impressed regarding the rise in circulation during 2020. We appreciated the clarity and thoroughness with which Mary Anne wrote the Annual Report. It really was important for us to see just how much our community is supported by Mary Anne, and are completely taken by her ability and how much she accomplished during this very difficult time. The Library is truly the heartbeat of our community. But it is truly amazing how much Mary Anne accomplishes as just one person. Her creativity, passion, dedication, and positive attitude go far beyond what is expected and even imagined and is above and beyond the call of duty. We are truly blessed by her ability to move and shift and not miss a beat even in very difficult times such as these and in an almost impossible situation especially considering the lack of running water and space. We discussed the idea of sharing this story with the community in a more public way.

The state has experienced a 3.4 % increase in revenue. This will be handed down to cities and towns with full funding in 2022 fiscal year budget. Not expecting a reduction in state aid.

Annual report approved unanimously and enthusiastically!

Mary Anne will talk to the Board of Health regarding possibly doing a program for the community around vaccines.
